

TOWN OF ARCADIA LAKES
COUNCIL MEETING
MAY 4, 2017

Town Council of Arcadia Lakes met May 4th at 6:00 PM in the Town Hall Conference Room.

Mayor Huguley opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

ATTENDINIG were Mayor Huguley; Mayor pro tem Don Davis; Council members: Peter Chesney, Linda Jackson, and Michael Smith. Also attending were Attorney Charles Cook, and Town Clerk Christine Murphy. No town residents were in attendance.

DEPUTY'S REPORT: Deputy Mastrianni reported that there had been quite a few car break-ins on Oakwood and Sylvan Drive, and the thieves are now in custody. Captain Duke said it was a 71 year old man on his bicycle, who had ditched his bike and stolen guns also. Deputy Mastrianni said the arrest should clear up everything they had in this area.

Deputy Mastrianni said there will be a Pizza Party, Saturday, May 13. from 6:00 to 8:00 PM at their new headquarters, to meet and greet all the officers who had been on the Live TV show recently.

APPROVAL OF APRIL MINUTES: Councilman Davis moved that the April 6th minutes be approved with corrections: Ms. Jackson seconded the motion, which was approved.

FINANCIAL MATTERS: Councilman Davis reported that the Town had received only \$80,000 of the \$108,000 budget. After discussion, it was determined that the Local Option Sales tax comes later in The year. as well as the MASC collections.

TREE PERMIT APPLICATION: Councilman Smith reported that he would like for the tree permit application forms to be amended to show a deadline of 90 days After discussion, Mayor Huguley moved to authorize Mike to amend the Tree Permit application to show expiration of ninety days, and follow up with an amendment to the ordinance. Mr. Davis seconded the motion, which was approved.

After approval, Mayor Huguley asked Mr. Smith to read the revised application as first reading, of a motion to amend the ordinance by stating that- " this permit is no longer valid after ninety days from approval." Mayor Huguley moved that the language be accepted to amend the Tree Ordinance. Mr. Chesney seconded the motion, which was approved.

DHEC VECTOR CONTROL CONTRACT: Mayor Huguley reported that DHEC has a Mosqito Control contract for Towns and Cities. He said he had talked with council member Jim Manning about getting further information about the program, and asked if they would approve Arcadia Lakes for their services.

TOWN LOT WARNING SIGNS: The wording for the No Trespassing signs for the Town lot was reviewed and approved by council. Christine was asked to have four signs made ,double the size, along with the stakes. Mayor Huguley said he had taken pictures of the storage containers on the lot, and they are both securely locked.

SECURITY CAMERAS IMAGE CONTROL POLICY: Mayor Huguley reported that the only people who would have access to a security camera would be the service provider. The use of dissemination of images from the camera would conform to the meaning of Criminal Justice purpose as used in the National Crime Information Center. The Contractor would access the cameras and give the images to The Sheriff's office. Any variance to that policy cannot be made by any individual. Images captured by the cameras cannot be retained for more than ninety days. Discussion was held.

Mayor Huguley moved that council go into Executive Session to discuss contractual matters, Landscape Maintenance, and receive legal advice regarding the same. In open session. If this motion is approved, council may take action on matters discussed in Executive Session, but there will be no votes taken in Executive Session. Ms. Jackson seconded the motion, which was approved.

Mayor Huguley reported that open session of the council meeting. was resumed, and no votes were taken in Executive Session.

Council member Michael Smith reported that he had seen an old dilapidated Ford truck that had a blue front end and steel body on the back and wood sides., with a flat bed and very short sides, piled with tree debris and no license tag, parked on the side of Trenholm Road, taking up one lane. The driver was trying to dump the tree debris on the sidewalk. When Mike approached him, he tried to drive off, he said.He asked council members to be on the look-out for the truck.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
